

## IMPERIAL TABLE XV.

### Language.

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NOTES 1. The population of the estimated area of East Manglün in the Northern Shan States, amounting to 19,649 (males 9,925, females 9,724) has been omitted from this table because statistics for language are not available. An estimate of the number of speakers of Maru, Lisaw, Nung, Kachin and Tibetan in the unenumerated parts of Myitkyina district, the "Triangle" and the Hukawng Valley is given in Chapter XII of the Report volume.

2. At the last census the language ordinarily used in the home was entered in the enumeration schedules ; at this census the mother tongue was entered.

3. The system of classification is given in Part IA of the table and is the same as that used at the 1921 Census. The indigenous languages have been formed into groups, branches, sub-families and families ; they include groups A to O and R (Chinese). For the sake of convenience all Chinese languages have been included among the indigenous languages. The remaining languages have been formed into three artificial groups, X, Y, Z, representing Indian, European, and other languages, respectively. The same classification system has been used for races in Imperial Table XVII. Group S has been used in that table to represent the Indo-Burman races but it does not occur in this table as these races do not have separate languages.

4. Provincial totals for each language and language-group are given in Part IB of the table. If an indigenous language is spoken in only one district the name of that district is given in the *Remarks* column of Part IB ; if it is spoken in only a few districts the figures for the districts which contain the majority of the speakers are given in the *Remarks* column ; the distribution of the remaining indigenous languages is given in Part IE (see Note 7). The names given in italics in the *Remarks* column are alternative names, names of dialects or names which have appeared in previous census reports.

5. Part IC is an alphabetical index of the languages and dialects and enables them to be easily traced in Part IB. To make this index save the purposes of Imperial Table XVII some names are included which are used for races but not for languages ; these names are marked with an asterisk.

6. Part ID gives the district figures for each language-group. Separate figures are given for speakers of English.

7. Part IE gives the distribution by districts of the speakers of the most important and widely spoken indigenous languages.

8. Part II deals with Bilingualism. Only certain indigenous languages are taken into account, all other languages being ignored. For the purposes of the table the languages were formed into the following five classes :—

- (i) Languages of the Burma group.
- (ii) Other Tibeto-Burmese languages, *i.e.*, languages of the Lolo-Muhso, Kuki-Chin, Naga, Kachin, Sak (Lui) and Mro groups.
- (iii) Languages of the Karen group.
- (iv) Languages of the Tai (Shan) group.
- (v) Languages of the Mon-Khmer branch, *i.e.*, the Mon (Talaing) and Palaung-Wa groups.

Persons speaking two or more subsidiary languages in the same class or subsidiary languages in two or more classes have been counted once for each class. Such persons have been counted only once for columns 3 and 4 of Part II.

### Race.

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NOTES 1. The population of the estimated area of East Manglün in the Northern Shan States amounting to 19,649 (males 9,925, females 9,724) has been omitted from this table because statistics for race are not available. An estimate of the number of Marus, Lisaws, Nungs, Kachins and Tibetans in the unenumerated parts of Myitkyina district, the "Triangle" and the Hukawng Valley is given in Chapter XII of the Report Volume.

2. The same classification system has been used for races as for languages (see Note 3 to Imperial Table XV on page 219).

3. Part I of this table corresponds to Part IB of Imperial Table XV and gives the provincial totals for each race by religion. Indians have not been classified by caste ; the Report volume should be consulted regarding the Indian races for which figures have been given. Figures for the separate European and allied races included in Group Y are given in Imperial Table XIX. The races shown with *nil* entries may exist in parts of the province outside the census area or they may have been recorded under some other name.
